Ruddell Road Retaining Walls

Location: Ruddell Road between Brentwood Dr. SE and 27th Ave. SE

11. Transportation-Related Construction and Consultant Contracts

Consultant contracts are advertised using The Olympian newspaper and the MRSC Roster. This request for qualifications (RFQ) includes the Title VI statement from the Standard Assurances document. The RFQs are rated by a group of Public Works staff members based on criteria outlined in the advertisement. The selected consultant prepares a cost estimate and scope which is negotiated, and the final professional services agreement includes Exhibit F, Title VI Assurances.

Construction contracts are advertised in The Olympian, The Seattle Daily Journal of Commerce, Builder's Exchange, and the City website. The solicitation includes the Title VI statement from the Standard Assurances document. The contract is awarded to the low bidder that meets mandatory bidder responsibility criteria. The contract itself has a Title VI section, where the contractor agrees to Title VI compliance, including in solicitations for subcontracts.

12. Actions Taken to Promote Construction Contractor/Consultant Title VI Compliance

For construction contracts, Title VI compliance is a part of the agenda for the preconstruction meeting. Title VI is also discussed with contractors/subcontractors in the field as part of on-site reviews and interviews. For consultants, Title VI compliance is discussed at the kick-off meeting. The Title VI language that is a part of the Non-Discrimination Agreement and the Standard Assurances are discussed in these instances.
