## NEED HELP PAYING YOUR BILLS DUE TO COVID-19?

Have you been impacted by the pandemic and need help paying your water, power, garbage, or internet bills — or rent? Qualifying families can get assistance with Thurston County's Rent Assistance Program.

#### **Who Can Get Help**

A renter in a household that at least one or more individuals meets the following:

- Qualifies for unemployment or has experienced a reduction in household income, incurred significant costs, or experienced a financial hardship due to COVID-19.
- Demonstrates a risk of experiencing homelessness or housing instability.
- Has household income at or below 80% of area median income.

#### **How to Get Help**

To get started, schedule an appointment with Community Action Council:

- By calling (360) 438-1100, press 8 for Housing, then 2 for housed services. (Open Monday-Thursday, 7 a.m. – 5 p.m.)

## RIGHTING A WRONG

Japanese Americans and World War II

After the attack on Pearl Harbor, Executive Order 9066 made legal the incarceration of Japanese Americans. These American citizens, young and old, were crowded

together in hastily built camps under military guard in poor living conditions for two and a half years. Some 40 years later, members of the Japanese American community led the nation to confront the wrong it had done — and urged Congress to make it right. This exhibit bought to you by the Smithsonian Institution.

## **From Parlor to Podium**

Explore the journey of women in Washington as they fought to gain the right to vote. The suffrage movement took women out of their homes and into the public sphere. You will learn about women like Charlotte French who in 1870 was the first woman to cast a vote in Washington, right here in Thurston County. It would be another 40 years before women's suffrage became the law of the land.

## TOILET REBATE UPDATE

Due to plumbing code updates in July 2021, the LOTT Clean Water Alliance Toilet Rebate Program now only provides rebates for Ultra-High-Efficiency Toilets (UHETs) with a Maximum Performance (MaP) PREMIUM rating. MaP is a testing program that rates toilet flush performance. Purchase an eligible UHET and receive up to a \$100 rebate from the LOTT Clean Water Alliance. Residential customers are eligible for up to three toilet rebates per installation address.



The Lacey Free High-Efficiency Toilet Program for water customers with an on-site septic system has not changed its standards. Water customers with an on-site septic system could potentially receive up to two free toilets to replace outdated high-flow toilets.
