The following are my findings and comments in association with the Request for Review by Tree Protection Professional form submitted by Chris Carlson with Hatton-Godat-Pantier, representing the property owners at 8401 Hogum Bay Ln NE. The owners are proposing a new 5,000 SF processing building to be constructed to the east of the current 12,000 SF grow facility. I visited the site on November 8, 2022.

***Findings and Comments***

The table below presents an inventory of the trees within the property, their locations are indicated on the attached site plan.

In addition to these 11 trees, there is a forested area along the southern property line, along the fence line. I believe these trees are within the parcel. They include (11) 6-20" Douglas firs in fair to good condition, (3) 8-16" madrone in fair condition and (1) 20" cottonwood.

No trees will be removed as part of the project although I am recommending that protection fencing be placed around Trees #1-11 as shown in orange on the attached site plan. Before the fencing can be installed, the existing adjacent asphalt will need to be removed. I am requesting that I be consulted prior to any site work to review the process and proper root pruning with the contractor as there is a high potential to damage these trees.
