CITY CELEBRATES LEGISLATIVE SESSION SUCCESSES

The City is very excited to share some incredible highlights from the 2023 State Legislative Session that will benefit the Lacey community. **The City is very thankful to our state legislative delegation for their support and leadership in 2023.**

2023 Highlights

- \$1.15M for ADA pathway and inclusive playground at the new Greg Cuoio Park.
- \$100,000 for a Regional Athletic Complex transformer upgrade to allow for more electric vehicle charging.
- **\$60M** for housing and wrap-around services for individuals living within state rights-of-way and other encampments.
- \$32.5M in 2025-27 and \$26M in 2027-29 for the I-5 Nisqually Delta. This is a long-term priority that will require state and federal support in years to come.
- Stopping the pursuit of potential future commercial airport sites that interfere with military operations, like Joint Base Lewis-Chord, and creating a new working group to explore Washington's future aviation needs.
- Allowing for a Reasonable Suspicion Standard for Pursuits of Certain Dangerous Crimes.
